Background: The Book of Joshua

God had Moses lead 2 million people out of Egypt

A journey that would take 40 years

• The 1st generation was not willing to trust God and have faith

Bible text: Joshua 1:1-2

Life Lessons for the Thrill of Victory

Life Lesson #1: COURAGE

God says: "Joshua, your time has come."

Courage is not the absence of fear, but it is what you are willing to do when you are afraid.

Bible text: Joshua 1:6-7, 10, 16

God says: "Joshua, get stronger and be bold."

Radical steps bring radical results.

To live courageously involves encouragement.

God's people were ready but they needed Joshua to be a strong leader.

Bible text: 1 Samuel 22:2, 30:6 - The illustration of David encouraging himself in the Lord

Joshua had courage because:

God will be invincible for you (Joshua 1:5)

God will be inseparable with you (Joshua 1:5)

God will be immovable for you (Joshua 1:5)

Life Lesson #2: FAITH

Hebrews 11:6 "But without faith it is impossible to please God."

Bible text: Joshua 3:1-2

God's timetable is not easily understood.

The richest blessings of God takes greater risks and faith.

A statement of faith must make a statement.

It's a defining decision accompanied by dramatic action that symbolizes your absolute commitment to Jesus Christ and His cause."

Life Lesson #3: SANCTIFICATION

Bible text: Joshua 3:5

One more thing that needed to prepare God's people to cross over the river Jordan

The best security for tomorrow's wonders are today's sanctifyings.

- 2 Corinthians 7:1 "Having therefore these promises, dearly beloved, let us cleanse ourselves from all filthiness of the flesh and spirit, perfecting holiness in the fear of God."
- 2 Timothy 2:21 "If a man therefore purge himself from these, he shall be a vessel unto honour, sanctified, and meet for the master's use, and prepared unto every good work."

If we are going to experience the thrill of victory, we must sanctify ourselves.
